

On 1 January 2021, the United Kingdom leaves the European Union and becomes a third country.

- All goods either entering the European Union from the UK or entering the UK from the EU must be declared to customs.
- The new procedures apply to all traffic with the UK, particularly vehicles using the ferry links.

This fact sheet applies to traffic using the ferry links between the United Kingdom and France

I'm a driver and my trailer's status is Orange - what do I have to do?

These statuses are continuously communicated on board the ferry and on disembarking in France, so that drivers know whether or not they are authorised to leave the terminal.

Get prepared & anticipate as much as possible

How do I know what my status is?

- During the crossing, the customs bar code document scanned on boarding is sent to the French customs "SI BREXIT" smart border system which informs the ferry company.
 - The smart border (SI BREXIT) set up by the customs service handles the status of goods.
- The ferry company informs the driver in real time, on board and on disembarking, of the status of the goods using the lorry trailer registration number:

Types of status

Find out what the statuses mean and what my obligations are

My trailer's status is

GREEN



→ I can leave the terminal (after completing my identity formalities at the border)

My trailer's status is





→ I must go to the SIVEP sanitary, phytosanitary or veterinary inspection centre

My trailer's status is





→ I must park my lorry in the dedicated "Orange parking area" at the terminal

What to do on disembarking in France

What do I have to do on leaving the ferry?

Join one of the dedicated queues GREEN/ORANGE/SIVEP







Special support crew are provided by the ferry companies to assist lorry drivers with disembarkation:

- o Identification of status: GREEN/ORANGE/SIVEP
- Identification of the channel to follow: "Exit"/"Orange parking area"/"SIVEP"

Report in and enquire what to do

Contact my customs representative

- The lorry is parked on the "Orange parking area"
- The ferry companies have assigned special crew to the ferry arrival terminals who can help with any formalities not yet accomplished or still required.
- If necessary, I call my manager or shipper or the customs contact I have been given to complete the correct formalities

The different "ORANGE" statuses

Understand why my trailer's status is "ORANGE"

TIR or ATA carnet

The goods I am carrying are under the TIR or ATA system.

- → ATA: (Admission Temporaire/Temporary Admission) The ATA carnet replaces the different customs documents normally required for a temporary import or transit operation.
- → TIR: (TIR Transit Transport Routier International/International Road Transport) The TIR carnet is a customs transit document used to prove the existence of the international guarantee for duties and taxes.

Resolution protocol

Present the TIR or ATA CARNET to customs at the terminal.

 Once the document is registered, customs releases the lorry and it can leave the ferry terminal.

Missing ICS declaration

- The customs import declaration has been made in advance and validated before arriving in the country, <u>BUT the ICS safety declaration has not been made</u>
 - → The transport operator is responsible for the ICS declaration, which must be sent at the latest 2 hours before the goods arrive in France.

Resolution protocol

My manager must contact customs to resolve the situation.

 Once it is released by customs, the trailer's status changes to green and the lorry can leave the ferry terminal.

Customs declaration not validated

- The ICS safety declaration has been validated.
 The customs import declaration has been made in advance, <u>BUT has not been</u> validated before arrival.
 - → The advance declaration must be validated during the crossing between the UK and France

Resolution protocol

The shipper or the representative for the goods must take the necessary steps to validate the advance declaration and/or contact customs to resolve the situation.

 Once it is released by customs, the trailer's status changes to green and the lorry can leave the ferry terminal.

Customs inspection

 The ICS safety declaration has been validated, the customs import declaration has been made in advance and validated, <u>BUT the goods must be inspected</u> by customs.

Resolution protocol

The representative for the goods must contact customs for the inspection procedure.

 Once the inspection is finished and the goods are released by customs, their status changes to green and the lorry can leave the ferry terminal.

SIVEP inspection:

 The goods have to undergo a sanitary, phytosanitary or veterinary inspection at the SIVEP as soon as they arrive in France.

Protocol:

- → The lorry must go directly to the SIVEP for inspection.
- →A representative for the goods must be present on the SIVEP site with the goods and to file the necessary documents for the sanitary inspection.

Note: A sanitary prenotification must be made in the TRACE NT system before the goods board the ferry in the UK.

- Once the sanitary inspection is finished and validated, the representative for the goods must complete the customs import formalities, including the validated sanitary documents.
- Once the goods are released by customs, their status changes to green and the lorry can leave the ferry terminal.
